**Ken Rollins, 66, recently retired as interim director of Tampa Museum of Art after 30 years as a museum professional. Previously he served as director of the Gulf Coast Museum of Art and the Polk County Museum of Art, receiving as Lifetime Achievement Award from the Florida Art Museum Directors Association (FAMDA) in 2007. CitiLife Magazine asked him what he's up to now: "My son Noah, (32), and I, are launching a unique art consulting business. We will be representing numerous artists**
